-Read the following passage carefully, then answer the questions below:

In a world that can often feel full of hardship, the story of Efren Peñaflores reminds us of the power of love and generosity. Efren, a Filipino youth from a poor neighborhood in the Philippines, decided to make a difference in the lives of poor children in his community through a simple movement.



Growing up, Efren watched the sufferings many children in his area faced; not being able to go to schools, limited resources, and few chances to learn. Moved by their troubles, Efren had an idea: he would create a "push-cart classroom" to bring learning directly to the children who needed it most.

Efren and his friends began asking people to donate for collecting school supplies, old books, and other educational materials. **They** improved an old push-cart into a mobile (moving) classroom, decorating it with bright colours and filling it with the donated items. Then, they went out to the streets, moved through the crowded alleyways and stopped in poor neighborhoods to offer free lessons to any child who wanted to learn.

The push-cart classroom became an instant success. Children who had never stepped foot in a traditional school cheerfully gathered around Efren and his friends to learn reading, writing, and mathematics. Seeing the excitement and **gratitude** in their students' faces made all the hard work worthy for the young mentors.

News of Efren's ground-breaking program quickly spread, and he was soon known as CNN's Hero of the Year in 2009. But for Efren, the real reward was not the awards, but the difference he was able to make in the lives of those he helped. Through his unselfish actions, he had not only provided educational chances, but also gave a sense of hope and possibility in children who had previously felt forgotten.

Efren's story represents the moral value of kindness - the determination to reduce the suffering of others and make a positive impact, even in the face of one's own challenges. His example reminds us that true wealth is not measured in having money, but in the lives we touch and the difference we make in our communities.
