Second, everyone who goes to college by definition is going to run this country one day. They are going to run the courts, they are going to design roads, buildings and infrastructure and they are going to run the hospitals, the schools and the businesses.

Patrick, who grew up in Accra, left Ghana in 1985 to pursue his own education in the U.S. There, he got a job at Microsoft. He admits that quitting Microsoft was not an easy decision and credits his American wife for supporting him. Committed to providing greater education opportunities in Ghana, he went back to school himself, earning a Master's degree at Berkeley, one of the world's top business schools.
