Romany is the language of the Gypsies. The origin of the Gypsies was long a matter of speculation. The English word *Gypsy* stems from an early belief that they came from Egypt. This has now been disproved.

The question was resolved by the science of linguistics. A detailed study of the Gypsy language has shown that the Gypsies originally came from India. The common features it shares with Sanskrit and later Indian languages can lead to no other conclusion.

The Gypsies are believed to have begun their migration westward about a thousand years ago. Loanwords in their language from Persian, Armenian, and Greek provide some indication of the general course of their travels. The Drinkable Book is a water filter and an instruction manual for how and why to clean drinking water. The book not only contains information about clean drinking water printed on its pages, but the actual pages themselves can be torn off and used as high-tech filters that will remove 99% of bacteria from the filtered water. This filter works to produce clean drinking water by pouring dirty water through a thick, sturdy sheet of paper embedded with silver nanoparticles (PAGE-drinking paper), which are lethal for microbes. This paper was created and shown to be highly antibacterial during Dr. Theresa Dankovich's Ph.D. work in chemistry at McGill University. The filters can last a couple of weeks, even up to a month, so the entire book could provide the tools to filter clean water for about a year. Theresa and a team of students tested these filter papers with water samples in South Africa at the WATERisLIFE sanitation program for the next step in developing the Drinkable Book for use in the real world. With WATERisLIFE, the filter papers have been successfully field tested in Ghana, Haiti, and Kenya. Hopefully soon, PAGE water filters will supply cheap clean drinking water for many, many people in the developing world who don't have access to it.

Snapchat is an image messaging and multimedia mobile application. One of the principal concepts of Snapchat is that pictures and messages are only available for a short time before they become inaccessible. Snapchat is primarily used for creating multimedia messages referred to as "snaps"; snaps can consist of a photo or a short video, and can be edited to include filters and effects, text captions, and drawings.

According to Snapchat's published statistics, in 2016, the app's users were sending 10 billion videos per day and by the end of 2016, the app had over 156 million users worldwide. In July 2016, Snapchat introduced a new feature known as "Memories". Memories allows snaps and story posts to be saved into a private storage area, where they can be viewed alongside other photos stored on the device, as well as edited and published as snaps, story posts, or messages. In August 2016, Snapchat launched Geostickers, a feature that lets users send city-specific stickers in snaps and messages. In January 2017, Snapchat added search functionality and a new global live "Our Story" feature to which any user can contribute. "Stories", consisting of pictures and videos, are viewed in chronological order, and each segment is accessible for 24 hours. Photo and video snaps presented to friends in the Stories functionality had surpassed person to person private snaps as the most frequently-used function of the service, with over one billion viewed per day.
