Tourists from all over the world travel thousands of miles to visit Egypt to see them closely. In the past, pyramids were holy places, where ancient Pharos believed that spirits passed into the afterlife. A lot of pictures, statues and writings were carved inside the pyramids to guide each spirit on its journey.

Building a pyramid was an **enormous** project. Thousands of workers worked hard for many years to finish building it.
