Present Continuous Passive

Let's look at how the passive works in other tenses.

Here is a sentence in the **present continuous**:

*They **are filming** the drivers in A4999.*

Now let's change it into the passive voice:

*The drivers **are being** filmed in A4999 (by them)*

We don't often use 'to BE' in the present continuous tense so this may look unfamiliar!

To make use of the p of the

'by them' doesn't tell us much. There is no need to know who's filming the drivers. So you can leave it out.
