





Today in my fridge, there are a few grapes, a bunch of bananas, some fruit juice, a pizza, and some burgers. I know what this food does to my body, but what does it do to the environment around me? It's time to think how different kinds of food use up our almanahi.com/kw earth's resources.

Firstly, labels give lots of <u>valuable</u> information: how long we can keep our food, how many calories it has and where it comes from. A few hundred years ago, most of our food came from places we could walk to, but today food travels thousands of miles. We refrigerate it, then transport it in planes and ships all over the world. This creates pollution and causes global warming. I look at the slices of pizza and immediately feel guilty - not because it's unhealthy, but because the prawns on <u>it</u> are from Thailand. 
