How much do you know about the history of some of your favourite foods? Do you know when people in England started cooking curry dishes? Do you know in which country pizzas or hamburgers were first made? Do you know where German cakes originated? The facts might surprise you.

Many people think the English found out about curry from people in India in the 1600s. In reality, wealthy English people were eating dishes made with curry spices hundreds of years before British ships travelled to India. In fact, we can know that because the word “curry” can be found in English language cookbooks as far back as 1377.

As for pizza, this dish was probably first made in Western Asia. People there were eating round, flat bread with cheese in the 500s. That was nearly 1,000 years before pizza caught on in Naples, Italy!

When thinking of German chocolate cake, most people think that it was brought to The American Midwest by German immigrants, but it is actually an American creation that contains the key ingredients of dark chocolate, coconut, and pecans. Its roots can be traced back to 1852 when American baker Samuel German developed a type of dark baking chocolate for the Baker's Chocolate Company. The cake was named, Baker's German's Sweet Chocolate cake, which was named in honour of him. The cake quickly **gained** popularity and America fell in love with the delicious tasty German Chocolate Cake especially that it went very well with coffee.

Finally, let's look at the truth behind hamburgers. Many people think hamburgers are an American food. However, according to some stories, hamburgers came from Hamburg, Germany. A German named Otto Kuasw created the first hamburgers in 1891. Four years later, German sailors introduced **them** to Americans.

Where foods come from isn't nearly as important as how they taste as long as they are delicious! So, go get some of your favourite food and dig in.
