#### **Part III: Reading Comprehension**

The world's only known white giraffe has been fitted with a GPS tracking device to keep poachers away in north-east Kenya after his mother and brother were killed in 2019. A conservative group said rangers could monitor the lone male giraffe's movements in real-time. Making sure that it stays in areas that have better security.

The giraffe has a rare genetic condition called leucism, which causes the loss of skin pigmentation. It is believed to be the only giraffe in the world with this condition. After poachers killed two of his rare family members, rangers are worried that the lone male, who has , will be . The two giraffes were found dead in a conservative area in Kenya's north-eastern Garissa County, on the border with Somalia, where the last white giraffe is currently living alone. The conservative group said the tracking device was attached to one of the giraffe's horns, and thus it would give hourly updates on the giraffe's whereabouts, enabling rangers to keep the unique animal safe from poachers.

The number of giraffe's in the world is on the decline. While countries like Kenya, Tanzania and Mozambique are looking to rebuild the **dwindling** numbers, 40% of the world's population has disappeared in just the last thirty years. Native to more than fifteen African countries, giraffes are the world's tallest mammals. They are haunted by poachers for their hides, meat and body parts. Giraffes have been designated as a vulnerable species on The International Union for Conservative of Nature's (IUCN) Red List, with an estimated population of 68,293 globally.



The storied layers of the desert have inspired Pritzker Prize-winning architect Jean Nouvel throughout his career from the Louvre Abu Dhabi to the National Museum of Qatar that takes its shape from a symbolic desert rose, i.e., a flowerlike aggregate of crystals of a mineral occurring in arid areas. And now it will also be the case with his newest design: Sharaan Nature Reserve, a resort hidden within the rock dwellings of AlUla, in northwest Saudi Arabia. Upon full completion in 2024, Sharaan will have forty rooms, three villas, and fourteen pavilions sprawling an area of over a million square feet. It is an ode to Nabatean design and to the sandstone rock sculptures of the Sharaan Nature Reserve, considered millions of years old. Nouvel led his team to imagine the resort's possibilities with the existing rock formations, allowing as much natural light to filter through the space as possible.

AlUla includes Saudi Arabia's first UNESCO World Heritage site of Hegra, the Nabatean kingdom's southernmost and largest settlement after Petra. "Petra echoes the same thing [as AlUla]," says Nouvel. "It is also architecture carved in the rock and has the same attitude [of reconciling heritage to the landscape]."

Located 200 miles north of Medina, AlUla is considered a place of extraordinary human and natural heritage. It is here that visitors can find Wadi Al-Qura (the Valley of Villages), an oasis valley sheltered by sandstone mountains that created an ideal environment for many civilizations, including the Dedanites, Lihyanites, Nabataeans, and Romans.
